Motorcycle Friendly Crows Nest

Crows Nest is in the high country north of Toowoomba, Queensland, on the crest of the Great Dividing Range. It provides easy access to a wide range of touring experiences. The tight roads of the Bunya Mountains, sweeping corners on the Darling Downs and South Burnett, the loops of Wivenhoe, Somerset and Perseverance Lakes are all available. They provide tours and scenic panoramas which should not be missed.

Tours from Crows Nest

- Blackbutt Range** **200km**
Cooyar, Yarraman, Blackbutt, Moore, Toogoolawah, Esk, Perseverance Dam
Drop down from the Hoop Pine plantations on the crest to the catchment of the Brisbane River below. The damage to the range road from the 2011 floods is fully repaired.
- Clifton** **240 km**
Haden, Goombungee, Drayton, Nobby, Clifton, Grantham
Visit historic Rudd's Pub in Nobby, the home of Dad and Dave.
- Jondaryan Woolshed** **155 km**
Acland, Jondaryan, Oakey, Meringandan, Hampton.
Take a self-guided tour of the historic museum village. Enjoy a delicious meal at the new Woolshed Café.
- Lake Wivenhoe** **245 km**
Lake Perseverance, Northbrook Parkway, Fernvale, Lake Clarendon, Spring Bluff.
Brisbane's water supply and flood mitigation for the Brisbane River. Check out the hydroelectricity power station on the eastern side. Try the pies at Fernvale.
- Lake Wivenhoe Loop** **205 km**
A shorter ride returning from Esk.
- The Bunyas** **300 km**
Haden, Brymaroo, Maclagan, Dandebah, Kumbia, Kingaroy, Maidenwell.
Rainforest-clad peaks shelter the largest stand of ancient bunya pines in the world. Discover waterfalls, panoramic views and colourful birdlife.
- Toowoomba Scenic Rim** **175 km**
Visit all the scenic lookouts of Toowoomba.
